Infants & Young Toddlers

Colors

Infants and toddlers will learn the colors red, blue, yellow, purple, green and orange. They will explore and experiment with these colors by using and mixing with paint and other arts and crafts. They will also learn these colors through songs, rhymes, and reading aloud.



Older Toddlers

Apples

Science: Jumping Apple Seeds. Children will add apple seeds to a glass of water mixed with baking soda and lemon juice to watch them JUMP!



Math: Apple Picking. Toddlers will pick and count apples from apple trees made in class.

Engineering: Building Apple Trees. Toddler will construct apple trees using empty toilet tissue rolls, popsicle sticks and red pom poms.



Pre-Schoolers

(Rainbow Preschool Room)

Change and Transitions

Math: Preschoolers will explore sequences and patterns with leaves of different colors and shapes. The children will create their own patterns and glue them on construction paper.

Engineering: Preschoolers will use popsicle sticks and leaves made from construction paper to build mini trees.

Science Experiment: Preschoolers will enjoy our crazy foam experiment which transforms everyday liquids into crazy exploding foam!

(Grey Preschool Room)

Welcome to School!

Math: All About Me Poster- This activity will encourage students thinking numerically as they complete this poster by using numerical representations of themselves. Once completed children will be encouraged to present their posters to their classmates.

Engineering: Children will work in two groups to build a schoolhouse out of popsicle sticks and other material. As a group, each child will give details about the school that they built.

Science Experiment: Apple eruptions. Students will use baking soda and vinegar to create an apple eruption. While using the different ingredients children will be able to identify the effects that it will have on the apples.

Produce Pal



Corn is called maize by most countries and is a cereal crop that is part of the grass family. An ear or cob of corn is actually part of the flower and an individual kernel is a seed.

Corn is rich in vitamin C, an antioxidant that helps protect your cells from damage and wards off diseases like cancer and heart disease.

Juices and soft drinks like Coca-Cola and Pepsi contain corn sweeteners. A bushel of corn can sweeten 400 cans of soft drink.
